•The annexe has 1 flat on the ground floor and 1 flat on the first floor.

•All bedrooms are en-suite, the flats can be adapted dependent on the needs. 3 of the flats are selfcontained and include a kitchen.

•The main building has a large communal kitchen and lounge. There is a smaller kitchen in the annexe.

•The home is located close to shops, a pub and restaurant. There are good transport links and the home has its own vehicle for drives out.

At a time that is right, we are able to offer a pathway to further independent living. This might include accessing one of our Supported Living or Outreach services. We strongly believe that every person we support should receive the right level of care in an environment that meets their needs wants and wishes.
